

REGULATIONS ON THE CONDUCT OF THE “3D MODELING” COMPETITION

1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

1.1 These Regulations establish the general rules for organizing, managing, and conducting all types of Computer Engineering competitions held in the Republic of Uzbekistan.

1.2 The Regulations serve as the main document strictly applied at all stages and directions of the competition. All additional regulations related to the competition must not contradict these Regulations.

The Regulations aim to achieve the following objectives:

- To develop scientific and technical creativity and increase interest in technology among citizens of Uzbekistan aged 16 to 30;
- To promote innovative technologies;
- To prepare the youth of Uzbekistan for recognition in the international arena.

1.4 All issues not specified in these Regulations shall be governed through the competition regulations.

2. COMPETITION ORGANIZERS

2.1 A special Organizational Committee shall be established to organize and manage the competition.

The Organizational Committee shall perform the following functions:

- Approving the competition regulations;
- Forming the panel of judges;
- Resolving technical and organizational issues of the competition;
- Reviewing narratives and appeals.

2.3 The Organizational Committee shall act independently in its activities, and all decisions shall be final.

3. COMPETITION PARTICIPANTS

3.1 Citizens of Uzbekistan interested in computer engineering and 3D modeling technologies may participate in the competition.

3.2 Participants are required to submit identity documents to participate in the competition.

3.3 Each participant undertakes the obligation to comply with these Regulations and the competition regulations.

3.4 Winners who occupied the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places in previous seasons of this competition are not allowed to participate.

4. PROCEDURE FOR CONDUCTING THE COMPETITION

4.1 Competitions shall be held in two stages based on the regulations approved by the Organizational Committee:

Stage 1: the preliminary stage – participants are selected for the next stage by evaluating their technical potential and skills. Stage 1 shall be organized at Tashkent University of Architecture and Construction;

Stage 2: the final stage, during which the main tasks are performed, and as a result, the winners are determined.

4.2 Participants and spectators are required to comply with the rules established by the Organizational Committee within the competition area.

4.3 Only persons authorized by the Organizational Committee are allowed to enter the competition area.

5. PANEL OF JUDGES

5.1 The panel of judges shall be formed by the Organizational Committee and shall monitor compliance with the rules throughout the competition.

5.2 The panel of judges shall perform the following functions:

- Ensuring compliance with the rules;
- Making final decisions in disputed situations;
- Evaluating participants' compliance with the requirements.

5.3 Decisions of the judges shall be final and not subject to review.

6. COMPLAINTS AND APPEALS

6.1 Participants may submit complaints to the Organizational Committee in written form.

6.2 Complaints must be submitted within 15 minutes after the end of the competition stage.

6.3 Appeals shall be reviewed by the Organizational Committee, and an appropriate decision shall be made.

7. PROHIBITED ACTIONS

7.1 The following actions are strictly prohibited:

- Using pre-prepared materials or materials obtained from internet networks (except for entourage, scaffolding, textures, and fonts);
- Receiving assistance from other persons without the permission of the Organizational Committee;
- Using mobile communication devices and internet networks during the competition;
- Directly or indirectly interfering with the participants of the competition;

- Using equipment not authorized by the Organizational Committee in the competition area;
- Using software other than AutoCAD while completing the tasks;
- Consuming or bringing alcoholic beverages, narcotics, or psychotropic substances into the competition area;
- Bringing animals of any kind into the competition area;
- Smoking in building areas and other prohibited locations;
- Any actions or inactions that may endanger the participants and spectators of the competition;
- Entering service areas without administrative permission.

7.2 Participants or visitors who violate these rules shall be disqualified and removed from the competition area.

8. SAFETY AND ORDER

8.1 Safety rules must be strictly observed during the competition.

8.2 Participants and spectators are required to follow the instructions of the Organizational Committee within the competition area.

8.3 The Organizational Committee shall monitor compliance with safety measures.

8.4 All participants and visitors must:

- Maintain peace and order;
- Follow the lawful instructions of the administration;
- Use facilities and equipment carefully;
- Conduct themselves responsibly to avoid endangering others;
- Not leave young children unattended.

9. ADDITIONAL RULES

9.1 Special rules and regulations of the competition shall be announced via the official website.

9.2 The Organizational Committee reserves the right to make amendments to the competition regulations.

9.3 In cases not covered by these Regulations, the decision of the Organizational Committee shall be considered authoritative.

10. ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS

10.1 All participants are required to provide additional documents and information necessary for conducting the competition and ensuring safety, upon request by the organizers and authorized security personnel.

10.2 During the competition, participants must follow the information markers provided by the organizers.

10.3 Each participant is personally responsible for the technical condition of their computer and the proper functioning of their software.

11. SUMMARIZING RESULTS AND AWARDING

11.1 Winners of the competition shall be determined in accordance with the established procedure for each direction of the competition.

11.2 Three prize-winning places shall be established in each direction. Competition winners who occupy the I, II, and III places shall be awarded diplomas and commemorative gifts.

11.3 Commemorative gifts may be provided by sponsors for special nominations or separately recognized works.

11.4 Organizers shall issue certificates to all participants and their supervisors for participation.

11.5 The Organizational Committee reserves the right to expand the list of competition prizes or special awards.

**These Regulations may be amended at least 30 days prior to the start of the competition. The updated Regulations shall be provided to all registered participants.*

“3D MODELING” COMPETITION REGULATIONS

Participant Age: 16–30 years

Stage 1: Preliminary Stage Regulations

Equipment and Tools: Computer, AutoCAD softwareUmumiy qoidalar:

General Rules: Participants in the preliminary stage are allowed to use personal computers.

Venue for Stage 1: Tashkent University of Architecture and Construction

1. Competition Conditions:

1.1 Participants are required to replicate the provided sample drawings in the AutoCAD environment in the shortest possible time and create the general (3D) view as specified.

1.2 All tasks at every stage must be completed strictly in the AutoCAD software environment.

1.3 A maximum of 60 minutes is allotted to complete the task.

1.4 In case of questions or technical issues, participants may not communicate with anyone other than the judges.

1.5 Final drawings must be submitted in .dwg format within the AutoCAD environment for evaluation.

1.6 Using computer resources for purposes unrelated to the competition is prohibited.

1.7 Participants may begin performing tasks only upon the signal of the judge.

1.8 After the judge signals the end of the round, any participant activity (pressing keys, moving the mouse, etc.) is prohibited.

1.9 Based on the results of the preliminary stage, 50 participants will advance to Stage 2 (the final stage).

2. Judging:

2.1 The Organizational Committee has the right to make changes to the competition rules (provided that such changes do not give an advantage to any participant).

2.2 Competition control and result announcements shall be carried out by the panel of judges.

2.3 Judges have full authority during the competition, and participants must comply with their decisions.

2.4 Judges may organize additional rounds in disputed cases.

2.5 If a participant is unable to complete the stage due to external interference or computer malfunction, a re-round may be conducted by the decision of the judges.

2.6 A participant dissatisfied with a judge's decision may orally request an explanation. The judge is obliged to justify the decision in accordance with the regulations.

3. Disqualification Conditions:

3.1 A participant may be disqualified in the following cases:

- Using pre-prepared drawings or models from the internet during task execution;
- Receiving assistance from other persons during task execution;
- Failing to comply with the competition organizers' safety requirements.

4. Winner Determination Rules:

4.1 The participant who completes the tasks completely and without errors in the shortest time shall be considered the winner.

4.2 Completed tasks are evaluated, and the best results are considered.

4.3 The number of rounds is determined based on the number of preliminary stage participants.

4.4 The 50 participants with the best results shall be eligible to participate in the final stage.

Stage 2: Final Stage Regulations

Equipment and Tools: Personal computer (laptop)

General Rules: Among the 50 participants advancing to the final stage, 3 participants (1st, 2nd, and 3rd place) will be determined as winners. Participants in the final stage must use their personal computers (laptops).

1. Competition Conditions:

1.1 Participants are required to replicate the provided sample drawings in the AutoCAD environment in the shortest possible time and create the general (3D) view as specified.

1.2 All tasks at every stage must be completed strictly in the AutoCAD software environment.

1.3 In case of questions or technical issues, participants may not communicate with anyone other than the judges.

1.4 Using computer resources for purposes unrelated to the competition is prohibited.

1.5 Participants may begin performing tasks only upon the signal of the judge.

1.6 The judge shall signal the end of the round only after identifying the participant who completed the task in the shortest time.

1.7 After the judge signals the end of the round, any participant activity (pressing keys, moving the mouse, etc.) is prohibited.

2. Judging:

2.1 The Organizational Committee has the right to make changes to the competition rules (provided that such changes do not give an advantage to any participant).

2.2 Competition control and result announcements shall be carried out by the panel of judges.

2.3 Judges have full authority during the competition, and participants must comply with their decisions.

2.4 Judges may organize additional rounds in disputed cases.

2.5 If a participant is unable to complete the stage due to external interference or computer malfunction, a re-round may be conducted by the decision of the judges.

2.6 A participant dissatisfied with a judge's decision may orally request an explanation. The judge is obliged to justify the decision in accordance with the regulations.

3. Disqualification Conditions:

3.1 A participant may be disqualified in the following cases:

- Using pre-prepared drawings or models from the internet during task execution;
- Receiving assistance from other persons during task execution;
- Failing to comply with the competition organizers' safety requirements.

4. Winner Selection Rules:

4.1 The participant who completes the tasks completely and without errors in the shortest time shall be considered the winner.

4.2 Completed tasks are evaluated, and the best results are considered.

4.3 The number of rounds is determined based on the number of preliminary stage participants.

4.4 The 3 participants with the best results shall be declared winners (1st, 2nd, and 3rd place).
